The deadline for submissions is April 15. The award will be presented at the Annual Meeting on May 15.





Primary Intensivists in the PICU

As pediatric intensive care unit physicians, our primary responsibility is to take care of our patients when they are critically ill. When the average person hears this, they generally think of intense situations that they see on TV. While this is certainly part of our job (and perhaps a big part of why PICU physicians chose this career), there is so much more to what we do in caring for patients.

After the more intense resuscitation period is over, patients often take a long time to recover from their critical illness and may have many ups and downs along the way to recovery. Many of our patients become what we refer to as "chronically critically ill", meaning that because of other comorbidities, such as chronic lung disease, heart disease, or cancer, that anytime they have a minor setback in their health they become sick enough to warrant an ICU admission. These patients get admitted frequently and may even "live" in the PICU due to their illness. All of this means that we have a significant number of longstay PICU patients in the unit at any given time.

All patients in the PICU are cared for primarily by the PICU team but these complex longstay patients usually have a number of consultants involved in their care as well. Between the high level of illness and the number of moving parts, it can be challenging to coordinate care in these patients. The schedule of the attending intensivists who are ultimately in charge of the care also adds to the challenge. Intensivists are generally "on service" in the unit for 7 days in a row and then hands off the service to another intensivist. While in depth handover is done the day before the change in physicians, smaller details about the overarching plan for more complex patients can be missed, which can inadvertently lead to fractured care delivery.

This is why we have developed a "primary intensivist" program in the PICU. A "primary intensivist" is in some ways similar to a patient's pediatrician in the outpatient world but is in the PICU. This intensivist is responsible for maintaining a relationship with the patient and family, being a point of contact for questions from the on service intensivist, attending care conferences, and taking part in big discussions and decisions about a patient's care.

Patients who are in the unit more than 2 weeks are discussed in weekly chronic care rounds. One of the things discussed during this multidisciplinary meeting is whether that patient qualifies for a primary intensivist. If that patient qualifies, either an intensivist who knows the patient and family volunteers or someone is assigned. The primary intensivist then discusses this with the family so that they are aware.

Since this program is new, we expect that there may be some adjustments and changes. Our goal is to make care for our long stay patients as seamless as possible, and we hope this program helps us get there.
