## *Division Happenings*

### **Behavioral Health Changes in Ohio**

This month we thought you'd be interested in changes coming to the state of Ohio in the way mental health services are delivered. In January of 2018 the state of Ohio embarked on a behavioral health redesign which will fundamentally change the way community mental health services are delivered across the state for both children and adults. The redesign, which was ordered to be implemented by Governor Kasich and led by his office of Health Transformation, will alter the clinical and business processes of community behavioral health providers through the adoption of coding changes, enactment of a completely new service array and the implementation of Medicaid managed care. Today, over 400,000 adults and children receive those services, at a total cost of approximately \$900 million dollars.

At the center of this effort is a proposal to rebuild community behavioral health system capacity across the state. The state is providing targeted investments to support initiatives such as:

- Developing new services for individuals with high intensity service and support needs;
- Improving health outcomes through better care coordination; and
- Recoding of all Medicaid behavioral health services to achieve alignment with national coding standards.

Locally, community mental health agencies such as Lighthouse Youth Services, St. Joseph Orphanage, Children's Home of Cincinnati and many others have been engaged in a process of clinical and business transformation, as well as conducting a legal review of their managed care contracts and other internal and external legal structures in order to assess how the redesign changes will impact their agencies. Starting on July 1, 2018 the community mental health system will move to a managed care environment.

As vital partners to Cincinnati Children's and the care we provide to patients, Cincinnati Children's is monitoring the transition carefully. Partners like Children's Home, Lighthouse, St Joe's and other community providers are essential to serving the mental health needs of the kids in our community.

# *KV PEACe Corner*

## Did you Know?

Trauma is defined as a deeply distressing or disturbing experience. We all experience trauma and no one is immune from its effects. Trauma can result from many different experiences, from a painful dental appointment, a car wreck, a house fire, surgery, death of a loved one, loss of a job, or abuse. It is critical for a person to work through trauma, so they do not become so impaired by it that it disrupts daily functioning.

There is a tendency to believe that a person who does not directly experience a traumatic event will not be affected by it. This is a myth. When this indirect trauma occurs it is called “vicarious trauma”. This refers to the traumatic experience that can occur when we are exposed second-hand to difficult or disturbing images and stories. When a person hears the stories of someone who has directly experienced a traumatic event it can evoke similar symptoms and emotions as the person who directly experienced the event. Care or health providers are especially vulnerable, but we all are susceptible to this emotional impact.

The Psychiatric Intake Response Center staff practice self-care as a way to cope with what we are exposed to. In our monthly newsletter we have a self-care corner that is devoted to identifying ways to care for ourselves and each other. Self-care strategies may include seeking support from loved ones, practicing relaxation, exercising, sleeping and eating well, etc.

Recognition by Kindervelt is also a means of supporting PIRC to let us know the challenging work we do is important and meaningful. In addition to your financial support, the recent gift of water bottles and the thank-you card was very much valued and appreciated. We are all grateful for the support.

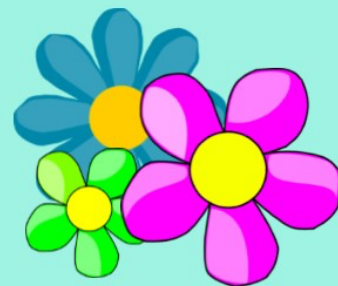

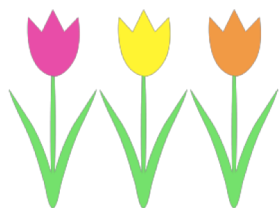
