This month we want to highlight a few of the mental health services available to our youngest patients.

Therapeutic Interagency Programs (TIP)

Our Therapeutic Interagency Program (TIP) is a full-year mental health treatment program that specifically targets preschool children. It is a seamless integration of child protection, mental health and Head Start preschool resources. The goals of treatment are to ensure and monitor ongoing safety, provide mental health services and enhance developmental / cognitive development.

TIP services are available to:

- Hamilton County residents
- Preschool children, ages 3 to 5
- Children from families with a history of childhood neglect, child abuse, family violence or other psychological trauma and are:
 - At risk or have evidence of developmental and/or behavioral problems
 - Experiencing behavioral and/or developmental problems serious enough to lead to their removal from home, school or therapeutic environment

Baby Therapeutic Interagency Program (Baby TIP)

Baby TIP is a full-year therapeutic program serving children from birth to 3 years old. Baby TIP provides mental health and developmental services for the child and caregiver using evidence-based treatment models.

Baby TIP services are available to:

- Children from the ages of birth to 3 years old
- Families with a history of challenges including childhood neglect, child abuse, family violence, addiction or other psychology trauma
- Children who are at risk or who have evidence of developmental, emotional and/or behavioral problems
- Children who are at risk of home, daycare or kinship displacement
- Parents/guardians who are facing permanency and custodial issues

Therapeutic Interagency Program (TIP) Clinic

The TIP Clinic serves children transitioning in or out of the more intensive TIP Preschool. This clinic allows children to receive their mental health and developmental services at an increased level compared to traditional outpatient in order to support mental health and developmental needs.

Trauma Healing Center

The Trauma Healing Center is an outpatient mental health program that specializes in treatment of children with trauma-related disorders. Services include evidence-based treatment models, psychiatric consultation, psychopharmacologic management and integration into community resources. The center serves children up to 12 years old.

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KV PEACe Corner

Seasonal affective disorder is a mood disorder characterized by depression in the fall and winter months when there is less sunlight. At CCHMC, we experience what I refer to as "seasonal school disorder" when students return to school. From mid –September until mid-December we experience an increase in patients coming to the Emergency Department seeking psychiatric assessment, and this pattern begins again in mid-late January. In mid-May and June, the volume begins to decline. Although sunlight may be a factor, it is the inability of the youth to successfully manage the challenges, responsibilities and relationships during the school year that increases stress, anxiety and depressive symptoms. Even with the most supportive network of friends and family, youth can have difficulty navigating these pressures.

Together, CCHMC's Department of Psychiatry and the network of community mental health providers offer hope to our youth and families.

- The KV Psychiatric Emergency Assessment Center (KV PEACe) continues to provide a calm and inviting area for the completion of psychiatric assessments.
- There have been discussions on how KV PEACe may be duplicated at the Liberty Campus.
- CCHMC is actively engaged with community mental health providers who have dedicated staff within the school to increase access to care. Many of these community providers are also able to provide support for their patients in KV PEACe.

Other Important Notations:

- 1. A Board of Trustees member cannot be President of their group although can hold another officer position.
- 2. A Board of Trustees member must attend Board meetings held the last Monday of the month August through May. Leadership Meetings held on the first Monday of each month October, November, February and March. Members Meetings held in one evening in the months of September, January and April. Annual Meeting in May.
- 3. It is important to have access to a computer or device that receives electronic information sent from the Board of Trustee and members of Kindervelt.

We are Listening...

Thank you to everyone who completed the survey following the Member Meeting on January 16. The Board of Trustees appreciates your input. We would like to address a few of the concerns that were presented in the comment sections of the survey.

- The purpose of the Member Meetings is to celebrate, reward, and acknowledge the hard work of all of our members. We understand that not every member is comfortable with the meetings, but over time, we hope you will give it a try. We have tried to locate the meetings around the tristate to accommodate all members.
- The cost of the member meetings DOES NOT come out of the money we raise for Cincinnati Children's. Our budget includes "operating costs" and these are paid by member dues. We do everything we can to keep the cost to a bare minimum. The Arhaus meeting cost us \$93 and the Hospital meeting cost us \$233. The meeting in April at Sabin Hall will cost us nothing.
- Quite a few comments asked for a more "hospital related" speaker. The speaker at the April Member Meeting will be the Chair of Cincinnati Children's Board, Jane Portman. We have tried to have a mix of fun, entertaining, educational, and informational speakers.
- There is concern with the decrease in Leadership Meetings (previously President's Council). To address this, we have already added a May Leadership Meeting and are discussing adding a December Leadership Meeting next year.
- We realize and apologize that there was a shortage of refreshments at Arhaus. All food was supplied by the Arhaus staff. I think we surprised them at how much a hard working group of Kindervelt members can eat. They, too, were upset about the shortage and apologized to us repeatedly. We will ensure that this will not happen in April.

Our final Member Meeting of the year will be held April 10 at Sabin Hall in Liberty Center. This is a lovely venue leased by Cincinnati Children's with a large indoor area for our meeting, and a nice outdoor garden area for socializing. Our speaker will be Jane Portman, the Chair of the Cincinnati Children's Board. Please mark your calendars and join us.


