The KV PEACe Corner is a new addition to the monthly newsletter. Each month, we will bring you information on how KV PEACe is making a difference on how your hard work and donations are making a difference in the lives of the patients and families we serve. In addition, we will share with you facts about mental illness.

The Psychiatric Intake Response Center staff thank you for the KV PEACe area. The area has become a favorite option for staff to complete psychiatric evaluations with patients. The area is quiet, peaceful and does not have the chaotic environment found in an emergency department. The area is more conducive to asking the difficult questions we have to ask our patients and families to determine the next steps.

MYTH: You're just sad, you're not depressed.

FACT: Just as heart disease is a biological disease of the heart and diabetes is a biological disease of the kidney, depression is a biological disease of the brain. Depression cannot be overcome through will power and is not related to a person's "character" or intelligence. Depression is a medical condition with varied levels of severity. Depression may disrupt a person's thinking, feeling, mood, ability to relate to others and daily functioning. Through medication management and therapy, recovery is an absolute possibility.

MYTH: Mental illness is uncommon.

FACT: Children across socio-economic demographics and cultures are diagnosed with mental illness. Mental illness does not discriminate. One out of five children between the ages of 13 and 18 have or will have a mental illness. In fact, 50% of all persons diagnosed with a mental illness begin at age 14.






