CCHMC Residency Program & National Shortage of Providers

For over a decade, many reports and studies have shown the undersupply of child and adolescent psychiatrists in the United States. One Surgeon General's report (1999) reported that only about 20% of children and adolescents with mental health illnesses receive mental health services. According to the Dartmouth Institute for Health Policy and Clinical Practice, there is an estimated one psychiatrist per 1,807 children who need services in the United States. Not a single state in the country has a sufficient number of child and adolescents psychiatrists. At the same time, the demand for mental health services is greatly increasing. This is why recruitment of medical students into Psychiatry training programs is essential for providing the needed mental health services for our youth.

In association with Cincinnati Children's, the University of Cincinnati offers one of the most wellestablished child and adolescent psychiatry training programs in the country. Residents complete three years of training in general psychiatry before joining our Child and Adolescent Psychiatry Fellowship Program (CAP) for two years. Each year, the Cincinnati Children's CAP program accepts up to 3 residents into the program.

The training program was started by Othilda Krug, M.D. in the mid-1940s at the University of Cincinnati. It developed the reputation of being one of the largest and best training programs for child psychiatrists, with a strong focus on psychoanalytic psychotherapy. The program has trained numerous child psychiatrists over the years. For the most part, the program directors have retained their positions for substantial periods of time: Othilda Krug, M.D. (1948-1984), Brian McConville, MD (1984-1995), Michael Sorter, MD (1995-2002), John Daniels, MD (2002-2005), and Suzanne Sampang, MD (2005-present).

Eventually, Cincinnati Children's Hospital became the major training site as this large medical center presented a vast array of training experiences. In 2004, the sponsoring institution was changed from The University Hospital / University of Cincinnati to Cincinnati Children's Hospital Medical Center to reflect this. The focus of the training has also changed as the field of child psychiatry has evolved. The focus of our educational program now is balanced between psychopharmacological/biological interventions and psychotherapeutic treatments. Our clinical and research programs continue to grow and expand, offering more educational opportunities for our trainees.

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KV PEACe Corner

Alaska has *The Bridge to No Where,* but CCHMC has the bridge to care - *PIRC Bridge Clinic*. In January of 2017, the volume of patients coming to the emergency department requesting psychiatric assessment was overwhelming. So, the Mental Health Task Force recommended a psychiatric clinic be developed to provide access to care for patients who were in crisis. This is when the Psychiatric Intake Response Center (PIRC) Bridge Clinic was implemented. The PIRC Bridge Clinic was designed to:

- minimize unnecessary emergency department visits
- minimize acute psychiatric admissions
- provide crisis management interventions
- support transition to ongoing mental health providers

The PIRC Bridge utilizes an integrated care model to help patients and family members access mental health services. The goals were simple and focused on improving the experience of the patient and families. Licensed independent clinicians, a psychiatrist, two APRN's and Intake Coordinators are the staff for the PIRC Bridge. The PIRC Bridge is not an outpatient therapy clinic. It is an alternative to the emergency department or psychiatric admission. The PIRC Bridge provides crisis appointments and telephonic support to begin the process of helping the patient begin to develop healthy coping skills, to manage the crisis event and to assist the patient and family on navigating the mental health system to secure ongoing services. A total of 876 patients have been referred to the PIRC Bridge since January of 2017. The percent of patients returning to the ED or in need of a psychiatric admission is about 2%.






