ANNOUNCING BLEED FOR A CAUSE 2.0

e are pleased to announce a revamp of the **Bleed for a Cause** program. The revamped program will allow all participating charities the opportunity to earn funds for their cause. The program continues to involve the community in recruiting blood donors; however instead of only a few winners – **all** participating charities can now benefit.

The **Bleed for a Cause** program will kick off with mobile blood drives (only) on Monday, July 17 and run thru Saturday, August 12. The program will kick off at NDC's on Monday, July 24 and run thru Saturday, July 29. Hoxworth Blood Center will donate \$5 on behalf of each donor to the charity of their choice.

- Hoxworth Blood Center created ballots will be available in the Café/Refreshment area at
 Neighborhood Donor Centers to be completed following donation.
- All ballots at the Neighborhood Donor Centers will have a blank space so that donors can write
 in their charity should it not appear on the pre-printed ballot.
- There will not be ballots at mobile blood drives.
- Charitable Organizations hosting a mobile blood drive will automatically be awarded \$5 for each
 of their donors there will be no ballots available at mobile blood drives.

Bleed For a Cause

Give blood for local patients and earn money for your favorite charity at the same time.

Hoxworth Blood Center is challenging area charitable non-profit organizations to recruit blood donors. Your charity will receive a \$5 donation for every individual who donates blood in the name of the specific organization.



Q: What is Bleed for a Cause?

Bleed for a Cause challenges charitable nonprofits to recruit blood donors for Hoxworth Blood Center. Charitable Organizations can earn \$5 for each individual who donates blood in their name.

Q: When is Bleed for a Cause?

Bleed for a Cause will begin on mobile blood drives, Monday, July 17 and run thru Saturday, August 12. The promotion will run at our seven Neighborhood Donor Centers Monday, July 24 thru Saturday, July 29.

Q: How do I get my nonprofit to participate?

You can check of the name of your nonprofit or favorite local charity on the Hoxworth provided ballot. There is a blank space for a write-in charity.

Q: What are key to recruitment?

A campaign of this type lends itself to grassroots and social media marketing. The keys to success are:

- BELIEVE you can recruit!
- ASK people to donate!

Then, ask them again. Then, remind them to donate. Thank them when they donate blood. They just saved a life! And they just made a \$5 donation to your charity.

Q. Can my nonprofit host a blood drive and have it count toward Bleed for a Cause?

Yes. To organize a blood drive, please call **Elizabeth Davis** at **513-558-1343** or via email at **elizabeth.davis@uc.edu**. There are a limited number of blood drive options available and they are awarded on a first-come, first-served basis to qualifying groups.

Q: Does my nonprofit have to sponsor a blood drive to participate in Bleed for a Cause?

No. Your supporters can donate at any Hoxworth neighborhood donor centers or mobile blood drive and state that they are donating for your organization. Even if you do host a blood drive, don't limit yourself to just that. Keep recruiting donors!

Q: Can only members of my nonprofit donate blood and vote for my organization?

No. Anyone...your members, your brother, your great aunt, your next-door-neighbor, your mechanic...can donate blood in the name of your nonprofit.

Q: If I forget to mention my nonprofit when I'm registering to donate, can I go back later and have Hoxworth registration staff enter my charity?

No. In order to tally points correctly, everyone must complete a ballot selecting their nonprofit of choice during the donor registration process.




