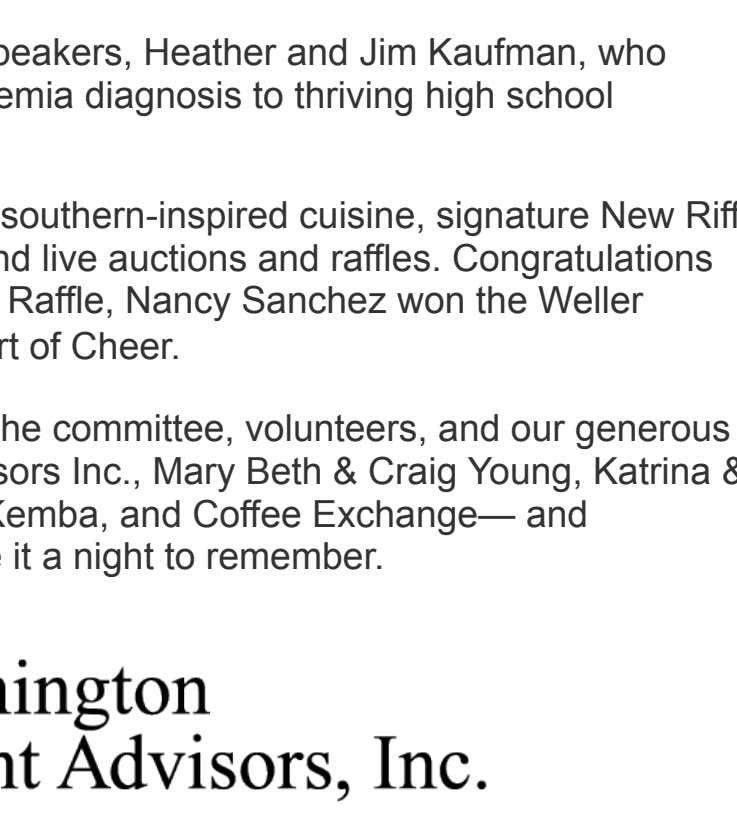
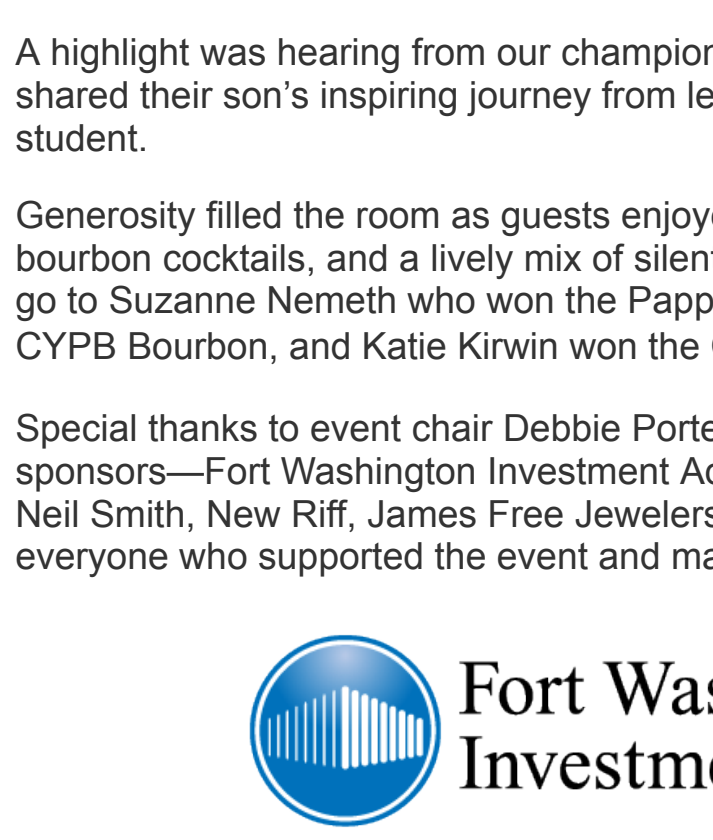
Group News & Tidbits
